

CHAPTER V

CONCLUSIONS AND SUGGESTIONS

This chapter is divided into two sub-chapters, conclusions and suggestions. The conclusion contains research findings based on the analysis and findings described earlier in chapter 4 based on the research questions that have been formulated. It consists of the conclusion of each objective in this study. In addition, in the second part, some suggestions regarding the research are given to several related parties.

5.1. Conclusion

In accordance with the previous chapter of analysis and findings, several conclusions regarding the word formation process from the terms found in the report published by the World Economic Forum can be drawn as follows.

Regarding data analysis on the word formation process, there are thirty-two economic terms used in the report, these thirty-two terms are formed by four-word formation processes, namely Borrowing, Compounding, Derivation and acronyms. The derivation is the most dominant word formation process used in forming a new word in the report, which is fourteen terms, the next is compounding where there are eight terms formed by the process, the third is borrowing which forms six terms through the process, the last is an acronym that contains four terms formed by this process. There were no other six processes in the terms found in the report.

Then, regarding the kind of morpheme, there are twenty-three roots and fourteen affixes, and only two combining forms are found in the data found to form the term.

5.1. Suggestions

From the research result above, the suggestions that give for the reader as well to other researchers who are doing the research related to this material, there are:

1. The author suggests the readers research the word formation process of economic terms for further discussion because many interesting aspects can still be analyzed in more depth. As for the object of this research, having chosen specific terms in the field of economics to be analyzed, the authors suggest conducting further research on economic terms found in much broader sources. It is very important to have a further understanding of words and their forms. Especially after the public is increasingly concerned about the hottest issues, especially regarding the global economy; people often have difficulty understanding the context because of the discovery of unfamiliar terms.
2. Hopefully, this research would be a reference for further study of morphology especially in word formation in the learning process for all of the linguistic students who are majoring English Department.
