CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

5.1 Conclusion

Based on the findings and discussions in Chapter IV, some conclusions can be drawn related to the formulation of the problem and objective of the research in Chapter I. The researcher formulates the conclusion into the following points:

First, the concept of the death drive in the Novel Me Before You by Jojo Moyes saw how a subject continues to see himself as something less according to the ideal image because of the loss of the symbolic order, therefore a subject wanted again the subject he believed to be his first place to get his ideal picture. Self-denial makes a subject want an endless ideal image, as seen in the novel Me Before You, Will is in a state of self-denial, because he does not want his life now as a result of the accident he experienced. This life according to Will is not suitable for him, because Will was formerly known as an active person. His desire to end himself because of the emergence of deficiencies from his own picture

In the concept of repetition, in the novel Me Before You as the situation where character Will the symbolic order keeps a subject to do the same thing over again and again. This condition can be seen in the Novel as Will's character who are experiencing the ups and downs of life to experience the suffering he experiences which sometimes he is happy in dealing with it.

In the concept of sublimation, in the novel Me Before You can be seen as the character Will mentions the ideal image and believes that his ideal image will continue to satisfy him forever. The character of Will thinks that he can be encouraging Louisa to be a different person that would be good, as Will ideal image was himself that ever did many things before he was quadriplegia.

In the concept of the gaze, in the novel Me Before You as the situation, the character of Will identifies his ideal image as a rich young man who can do many things like extreme sport and also traveling. However, Will, ideal image is destroyed by an accident that he had 2 years before that make his life changed. This also brings anxiety for the character Will.

Second, these impact of the death drive to the characters inside the Novel Me Before You such as anxiety, depression, impulsive attitude, and self-destruction. Those impacts are the result of Will's character's inability to deal with the problems and conflicts he faced that occurred due to quadriplegia that he experienced. The subject in the process of identification in the mirror stage identify themselves as having a lack and has desire himself to find his ideal image. The death drive forms in the Novel Me Bofore You are the effect of Lacan's psychoanalysis that caused anxiety, depression, impulsive attitude, and self-destruction.

5.2 Suggestion
