CHAPTER V

CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

5.1 Conclusion

This chapter discussed about the conclusions that can be taken from the research. The research analysis and findings about the analysis of directive illocutionary acts that were performed in season 2 of the Netflix series "Insatiable" led to several main conclusions. First of all, there were 8 types of directive illocutionary acts found in Netflix series "Insatiable" season 2 such as ask, order, command, request, beg, invite, permit, and advise. The most common types of directive illocutionary acts that showed in Netflix Series "Insatiable" were the types of ask. This type was mostly showed because the speaker frequently giving questions to the hearer. Secondly, there were five forms of directive illocutionary acts that showed in Netflix series "Insatiable" season 2. The most common forms of directive illocutionary acts that showed in Netflix Series "Insatiable" were the forms of interrogative. Those forms were common because the speakers often ask a question or asks for permission or make a request and also gives order and commands.

5.2 Recommendations

After this research is finished, the researcher contains some recommendations to other researchers who was conduct the similar research, particularly about pragmatics. More research on the usage of the term directive illocutionary acts for communication in society, especially in the English speaking community, is very

important. It is because English is an international language that is already widely used in almost every country when communicating. This is linked to the fact that English is widely used throughout the world and has developed into an international language, requiring a good comprehension of a language, particularly when determining someone's intended meaning. The communication context had an impact on the result of this research about directive illocutionary acts because different communication context result in different kinds of meaning and comprehension. Moreover, the researcher expects the other researchers would conduct different objective of research in order to avoid the high risk of plagiarisme.
