## CHAPTER V CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

Based on the research analysis and research findings in Chapter IV before, some conclusions and suggestion in this chapter can be made. The conclusion is drawn related to the formulation of research question and the identification and the objective of the study which stated in Chapter I. The suggestion is written here in this chapter both for the researcher and also the reader of this research.

### 5.1 Conclusion

As the researcher has analyzed the archetypes of hero's journey in novel of *Twenty Thousand Leagues under the Sea* by Jules Verne by using the theory of the *Monomyth* or Hero's Journey by Joseph Campbell (2004), the conclusion was drawn. The conclusion here answers the question mentioned in the first chapter of this research.
