

CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

5.1 Conclusion

In this section the research comes to conclusions related to the formulation of the problems and the objectives of this research. They are describing the depiction of Donald Trump and discursive practice of Donald Trump depiction in Al Jazeera news.

5.1.1 Textual Analysis of Donald Trump Depiction in Al Jazeera news.

The findings of this research reveal that most of the process occurring in the Al Jazeera news are material process (15 out of 30 data). There are 33 processes found in Al Jazeera news. It is found that process in the material process forms have the highest frequency. The processes involved by 27 of participants roles consisting of 16 actor participants, 10 goal participants and 1 beneficiary participant. The low process in the depiction of Donald Trump in Al Jazeera are mental processes occurs 2 out of 30 data, this process involved by 4 of participants consisting 2 participants sensor and 2 participants phenomenon. Furthermore, there are two types of process that are absent in the whole text, namely the behavioral process and existensial process.

Based on the finding the researchers concluded that Al Jazeera as a news media indicates the presence of Trump which is much contained in the material process. Activities undertaken by characters and / or by involving other figures and

entities can show the physical activity that has been done. Most of the process from Al Jazeera is depicted Trump as a successful businessman instead a good politician. There two process absent in this depiction, they are behavioral process and existential process. The behavioral process is processes of physiological and psychological behaviour, like breathing, coughing, smiling, and dreaming in the data analyze the researcher does not find this process depiction of Donald Trump by Al Jazeera. The another is existential process are processes of existence. In the data analyze Al Jazeera tried to depict Trump as the successful businessman not tried to depict about the existence of Trump as the businessman.

5.1.2 Discursive Practice of Donald Trump Depiction in Al Jazeera news

As seen in the research finding that Al Jazeera used the word “has survived” and “won” (implied in data 6, data 13, and data 14) they indicate that Al Jazeera does not expect that Donald Trump will win in the president election in November 2016. Al Jazeera also used the word “a fixture of popular culture”, “the property mogul”, “the path to his riches”, “global stardom”, “as a “small loan of million dollar” from his father”, “the fledgling New York property developer“ and “the now-accomplished businessman“ (implied in data 1, data 2, data 3, data 11, data 18, data 25 and data 26) they indicate that Al Jazeera tried to depict Trump as a successful businessman. Trumps also stated in his speech if he had planned to ban Muslims (implied in data 14).

The researcher concludes Al Jazeera implied that they do not expect Trump will be the 45th president of USA now since they tried to depict Trump as the

businessman better than as the politician and also Trump has been taken a long time to be a president like now. Al Jazeera also tried to describe that Trump has plan to ban all Muslims and illegal immigrants for entering in USA.

5.2 Suggestion

Through this paper, the researcher suggests for English learners who are interested in critical discourse analysis especially to analyzing depicting controversial figure in different aspect and will be more interesting if another research use a large amount of data taken from various source in depicting another international controversial figure. Since in this research the researcher analyze in two dimensions only; textual and discursive practice analysis. Finally, the researcher hopes that this study will be useful for the future improvement of English learners as a reference, especially about Fairclough's CDA theory.
