CHAPTER V CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

This chapter contains the conclusion and suggestion of the research that have been done by the researcher. The conclusion based on the result finding in chapter four. The suggestion is made for further research in the future for those who are interested in this research namely figurative language.

5.1. Conclusion
