## **CHAPTER V**

## 5.1. Conclusion

Next, the love and belonging needs of Jean Valjean are illustrated when Jean Valjean adopts Cosette as her daughter and he loves Cosette very much. For 25 years, Jean Valjean had been alone in the world. He had never been a father, lover, husband, and friend. However, when he sees Cosette, he leaves his heart moves. All the passion and affection within him awakes towards her. It means that he is currently feels the affection and love from family, but the love from friends and intimacy he didn't get it.

Fourth, the esteem needs of Jean Valjean are explained when Jean Valjean's social status as mayor of Montreuil-sur-Mer brings him a high esteem. It means that his social status as a wealthy factory owner and a mayor of the town Montreuil-sur-Mer bring him to fulfil his esteem needs, in this point, he receives an achievement, mastery, independence, status, dominance, prestige, self-respect, respect from others.

The fifth is self-actualization needs of Jean Valjean are proved when Jean Valjean dies in peace. Jean Valjean is the unhappy of men in the early of his life who had become an honest man. He had repented of the evil that he had done and forgiven the evil that had been done to him. Hence, he dies a happy death by knowing that he has become a loving and compassionate man. It means that he has been realized of his personal potential, self-fulfillment, and his peak experiences.

The last is process of the completion of Jean Valjean's hierarchy of needs. All of the process he passed not always smoothly as he wants. Never give up and do anything right to complete his needs is the way of completion of Jean Valjean. The process of the completion his need make him appraise what he got.
