ABSTRAK

This research intends to examine the hero patterns in Anthony Hope's novel "The Prisoner of Zenda" which features Rudolf Rassendyll as the main character. Joseph Campbell's hero patterns hypothesis theory will be used to examine the hero patterns. This research includes three limitations. Campbell stated that the hero patterns is constituted of three essential phases: Separation, Initiation and Return. These three stages could be elaborated into several 17 sub-stages. The separation which the first limitation. The second limitation is initiation stages. The third limitation which last stage which is the return. The researcher chose the novel "The Prisoner of Zenda" because it provides a framework for this research. Archetypal approach will be used for this research. This research will use a qualitative method and data will be collected in the form of quotations. Data collection will use a documentary method that uses descriptive qualitative research. This research uses a descriptive narrative method that is presented to help readers easily understand it. The result form this research is Rudolf Rassendyll as the hero has passed three phases of hero patterns and 15 sub-stages of hero patterns based on Joseph Campbell theory
