CHAPTER III

RESEARCH METHODOLOGY

This chapter describes the research technique that was employed by the researcher. It is important for the researcher to specify the research technique in a study. This chapter includes the research design, research object, data collection method, data examination method, and analysis result presentation approach.

3.1 Research Design

The qualitative method that uses in this research. According to Merriam & Tisdell, (2016) the collection and analysis of data consists of words carried out in various ways. In data collection, data analysis, and the results include conclusions in the form of descriptive or written in words.

The reason why this research uses qualitative methods because of the data source, research or data collection and the results along with conclusions in the form of writing or descriptive. morever qualitative approaches incorporate text and image data (John W Creswell & Creswell, 2018).

The Handmaid's Tale by Margaret Atwood is widely regarded as a masterpiece of dystopian fiction. Its advantages lie in its profound exploration of themes such as power, gender, and autonomy. The novel's ability to resonate with contemporary issues related to women's rights and political control has made it a timeless work. The novel's complex characters and intricate narrative structure further enhance its literary merit, making it a critical tool for discussions on feminism, politics, and human rights.

The Handmaid's Tale has received numerous accolades since its publication. Some of the most notable awards include: The Governor General's Award for English-language fiction (1985)This prestigious Canadian award recognized Atwood's outstanding contribution to literature, The Arthur C. Clarke Award (1987) was honored as the best science fiction novel published in the United Kingdom, and Los Angeles Times Book Prize (1986): Atwood's novel was awarded in the Fiction category, acknowledging its excellence in narrative and thematic depth. The Handmaid's Tale has been adapted into various formats, each contributing to its cultural significance: 1990 Film Adaptation: Directed by Volker Schlöndorff, this film brought the novel's dystopian vision to the big screen, with a screenplay by Harold Pinter. 2017 Television Series: Perhaps the most famous adaptation, the Hulu television series, has been critically acclaimed and widely popular. Starring Elisabeth Moss as Offred, the series has won several awards, including "Emmy Awards" and "Golden Globes", for its powerful portrayal of the novel's themes and its relevance to contemporary issues. Stage Adaptations: The novel has also been

adapted into stage plays, offering live audiences an immersive experience of Atwood's dystopian world. These adaptations have been performed in various countries, reflecting the global impact of the novel.

3.3 Method of Collecting Data
